<b>African Diaspora Association of the Maritimes</b>	<b>Web-based information access project for facilitating the integration of African immigrants in Nova Scotia</b> The proposed web-based information project is aimed at enhancing the social and economic integration of African immigrants through the provision of information needed for accessing essential social and economic services within Nova Scotia. Primarily, the project targets two categories of users with different needs: adults who are looking for various social and economic services, and African immigrant youth who want to recreate and build relationships that will have educational and employment outcomes.	\$5,368.80
<b>Association of Internationally Educated and Trained Professionals of Nova Scotia</b>	<b>On-line support for professional integration of immigrants in Nova Scotia</b> The project will develop on-line video tutorials for internationally educated professionals in medicine and engineering enabling them to clearly determine their capacity to enroll in their profession in Nova Scotia, define their next steps, and associated timelines and costs, to effectively manage/adjust their career development in Nova Scotia, and to build a path to make their transition to the province, to integrate into their professional community and to ensure their retention in Nova Scotia.	\$9,900.00

A section will also be developed on opportunities for starting a business.	\$10,000.00
<b>Fédération acadienne de la Nouvelle-Écosse</b>	<b>Développement de nouveaux contenus à l’intention des immigrants potentiels et des nouveaux arrivants d’expression française</b> This project involves two categories of activities, development of new content for potential immigrants as well as addition of content to facilitate integration of immigrants and refugees already settled in Nova Scotia.	\$8,666.00
<b>Halifax Immigrant Learning Centre</b>	<b>Website information for internationally educated professionals</b> The website developer will develop 6-10 additional professions (including trades, information technology, financial, business, hospitality, architect), to the internationally educated professional list on the website, together with pathways to licensure as necessary. Success stories/audio testimonials for the top 10 professions will also be developed and added to the website.	\$10,000.00
<b>Metropolitan Immigrant Settlement Association</b>	<b>Increasing access to web information</b> This project will be used to improve the Metropolitan Immigrant Settlement Association website by increasing and easing access to information about integration and settlement in Nova Scotia. More particularly the project will provide detailed information in French along with relevant links to other Francophone supports and organizations. This will be done in partnership with the Fédération acadienne de la Nouvelle-Écosse to ensure there is no duplication of efforts and that relevant information is well linked to all French supports and services.	\$9,950.00
